



Ready Golf at Little Hay Golf Club



On the tee: The priority is to get shots played.

The first player on the tee who cannot reach those in front should be the one to play. If a ball is hit into the rough, remember to note the line it was on (by picking a tree or other fixed marker). If it looks like it could be difficult to find, play a provisional.

Marking cards for a previous hole should happen after your tee shot if you are first off or while others are playing if you are not first.

On the course (before the green): Players do not have to play in order of distance from the hole. Play as soon as it is safe to do so. Those not hitting a shot should begin to prepare themselves for their shot ahead.

If a ball is potentially lost, other players should continue to hit their shots until they are beyond the point the ball is thought to have finished and join the search for the lost ball together on the identified line. Only 5 minutes is allowed for searching for the ball which begins when the first player arrives at the identified area.

On the green: The flag should be attended or out. On arriving on the green, if you can play without treading on someone's line and you are waiting for the furthest away to arrive - do not wait for them, play your shot. Please finish out whenever possible instead of marking. Remember, if you take just 1 minute a hole less that's 18 minutes a round.
